Our church's annual congregational meeting was held last Sunday, January 28 as a number of reports were presented from various committees and organizations in our church. It is exciting to see more people engaging in our ministry, attending worship, participating in our programs, and connection with us through our online presence.

During our meeting the following members were elected to serve on our leadership team: session members elected to a three year term are Tricia Harrison, Erin Heringer, John Reed, and Ernie Watters. Tricia and John are coming back to serve a second three year term, which is permissible via our by-laws. Deacons elected to three year terms are Jennifer Burns, Becky Dixon, Deanna Hansard, and Sandi McIntosh. Jennifer and Deanna are both returning to serve a second term.

Erin Evans, Larry George, Bill Lorentz, and Bernice Phillips were elected to serve on our church's nominating committee in 2024. These individuals will work with me this coming fall to come up with nominees for elders and deacons to present at our congregational meeting next year.

Our 2024 budget was presented and will be approved at our February session meeting. A budget of \$562,719 includes \$102,000 in charitable mission giving, a cost of living raise for staff members, and a few adjustments to committee budgets.

The season of Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 14 with a special worship service at 7pm. During the season of Lent I will be preaching a sermon series titled "Thy Will Be Done." We will be looking at seeking and implementing God's will in our lives and free Lenten devotionals will be available for the congregation. -Pastor Dave

Our Church and Society Sundays at 9:30 AM in the Church & Society Room. A different guest present every week. Here is the lineup for February:

February 4: Nick Enslow, Area Director for the Boys and Girls Club of Yellowstone County, TEDx speaker. "Building Generational Wealth Through Relationships." We have many problems that are bankrupting our youth; Gun violence, Depression and Suicide, Drugs and Alcohol and more. As these problems build, they are affecting more of our youth, making the problem seem harder to solve. Nick, pulling from his decade and a half experience in youth development with the Boys and Girls Clubs, will speak to the simple yet impactful solution that can help our youth out of this Generational Bankruptcy and into Generational Wealth.

February 11: Dr. Danell Jones, High Plains Book Award Winner, will present "The Girl Prince: Virginia Woolf, Race and the Dreadnought Hoax." In February 1910, a young Virginia Woolf and friends played the most famous practical joke in British military history. Blackening her face and masquerading as an African prince, they conned their way onto the Dreadnought, the Empire's renown battleship. The stunt made headlines around the world. Danell Jones's new book The Girl Prince intertwines the story of the scandalous prank and Woolf's ideas about race with the true Black experience in Britain. Jones explores why this novelist joined in a bigoted prank and probes what it tells us about Woolf's Britain.

February 18: Kim Lewis, President and CEO of United Way of Yellowstone County. Her will present "Sixty-two Years of Positive Impact." From helping the elderly to the very young, Kim will detail the myriad ways United Way works with people of Yellowstone County to improve health, education, and economic mobility. By connecting with partners, donors, volunteers, and community leaders United Way extends its reach worldwide in 1,100 communities in 37 countries.

February 25: Ron Nordlund, Retired Banker. He will talk about "My Experience from the 1959 Hebgen Lake Earthquake." Ron's family was spending their annual summer vacation in a cabin on Hebgen Lake when that devastating earthquake hit. Ron was nine years old and will detail his recollections of that day and the aftermath.
