Session Notes: The Session met on Tuesday, March 12, 2024. The Finance committee reports that First Presbyterian Church is in a strong and stable financial position. All reports indicate that the church is where it should be for this time of year. It was stated that we have a very kind and generous congregation.

The retaining wall that is being built around the south end of the church is progressing ahead of schedule. Permission was granted for Pastor Dave to perform the baptisms of Mack and Kennedy Thayer on Sunday, April 28, 2024 at the 10:30 worship service.

The session approved that Sandi Schoenberger be allowed to serve as the liaison between the Session and the Foundation.

Church and Society class schedule for April

Our Church and Society Sundays at 9:30 AM in the Church & Society Room. A different guest present every week. Here is the lineup for April:

April 7: Dr. Erwin Garcia-Velasquez, Superintendent of the Billings Public Schools; Ione Young, Yes for Safe Schools Billings Co-Chair. "Initiatives to Bridge the Gap-Preventing Dropouts and Violence." Reading proficiency affects students' experiences and perceptions and can lead to dropping out of school. Research data connects dropouts to acts of violence, which are occurring in our community. Dr. Garcia will explain how BPS is addressing these issues through three initiatives. Also, learn about the significant defects found in the safety audit of BPS and how those can be resolved.

April 14: Jim Gransbery, Retired Political and Agricultural Gazette Reporter. "Moral Responsibility and Courage in the Face of Authoritarianism." Jim will focus on five historical figures: Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Titus Grandsma, Hans and Sophie Sholl, and Oscar Romero. Learn how four of them stood up to authoritarianism in their defiance of the Nazis and the fate that awaited each of them. Jim will also explain the circumstances of Oscar Romero's death when he was Archbishop of El Salvador.

April 21: Dr. Tim Lehman, Professor of History and Political Science, RMC. "A Post-Truth America?" His presentation will look at our society's difficulty of establishing a common ground for truth in recent decades, including conspiracy theories, alt-media, and more. He will also include a historical look of this topic, including mistruths about religion.

April 28: Nancy Van Maren, Executive Director of Nations to Neighbors Montana (N2N). N2N is a faith-based community organization begun in response to the mass evacuation of Afghans in August 2021. With 100% community support and funding, N2N resettled four Afghan families into Billings during 2022. In 2024, a national resettlement agency began preparing to welcome refugees from all over the world into Billings. Nancy will discuss how N2N will work to help refugees thrive over the long welcome—the many months it requires to learn all that we take for granted and to develop a sense of belonging—first on providing a summer program for refugee children and mentorship opportunities.
